BEHAVIOUR

We have introduced a more structured approach to behaviour that is both relational and fair, helping to create consistency across the school. We are working with behaviour expert Hannah Hall to establish the approach in a supportive way.

We believe that this will strengthen our school culture and help pupils feel safe, understood, and ready to learn.

CHANGES

You will be aware already that from half term we are making some changes to the organisation of the school day to support all pupils.

These are:

- Changing the timings of lunchtime to create a shorter afternoon session to support regulation
- We have made adjustments to the afternoon timetable to help reduce cognitive load and better support pupils' focus and wellbeing throughout the day.
- To support consistency and reduce transitions throughout the day, Key Stage 3 classes will receive more of their teaching within their form rooms.

These changes have been carefully thought through, and we believe strongly they are in the best interests of individual pupils and the whole school community. We will review the impact of these changes, to confirm that the new plans are working effectively.

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
